5. Financial Report for Jan. 1 to December 31, 2024 – Treasurer Lorraine Poisson (Start time on recording - 4:46)

- Statement of Revenue and Expenses

7. Extraordinary Resolution re: Process for Financial Audits / Appointment of Barry Pond as Financial Peer Reviewer for 2025 (Start time on recording - 15:26)

Per ONCA rules, the LTCA at this time would like to introduce an "Extraordinary Resolution" asking Members to waive the requirement of an audit or review by a CPA, and in its place would like to ask Members to accept a financial review completed by peers within the LTCA membership going forward. 8. Membership Report and 2025 To Date – Report by Treasurer Lorraine Poisson (Start time on recording - 17:15)

- As of August 12th, 149 LTCA memberships had been sold. As of August 7th, the Summer Students have finished visiting all cottages/homes except for McCool Bay and Rice Bay. Our goal is to get 170 members.
- The emailing of QuickBooks Invoices and use of E-transfers to collect membership has proven to be very beneficial.
- The use of the Square wireless payment system is continuing to grow in usage.
- Previous Members who have not yet paid their 2025 memberships will be re-invoiced.
- Final numbers of memberships for previous years were: 162 (2024), 145 (2023), 160 (2022), 146 (2021), 132 (2020), 142 (2019), 133 (2018), 136 (2017), 156 (2016), 130 (2015), 137 (2014), and 141 (2013). There are approximately 240 cottages/homes on the waterway.

9. Ontario Parks Summer Student Grant and Canada Summer Jobs Funding – Report by Brian Baker (Start time on recording - 21:10)

- Ontario Parks has paid \$3,500 for work carried out in designated areas of Mattawa River Provincial Park. An Activity Report will be submitted to Supt.
- The students have been working 30 hours per week.
- LTCA applied for 2 Canada Summer Jobs Grants for 2025 and both were approved which is a significant savings to our Association. LTCA pays \$18.00 hourly plus 4% Vacation and daily allowance for supplying boat & motor.

10. Donation of Boat & Motor by Mary Farmer (Start time on recording - 24:50)

 A longtime LTCA Member, Mary Farmer has donated her 14' aluminum boat and 15 hp outboard motor for use by the LTCA Summer Students. This very much appreciated donation will enable all future summer student candidates to be eligible as they will no longer need to supply a boat & motor as a condition of employment. Motor repairs, new oars and seats were needed at a cost of \$1,000.

11. 2025 Summer Student Report – Supervisor Clint Wilson, Landon Bell & Hayden Stockill

 2025 LTCA Summer Student Report
- Clint and Hayden detailed the work the students did this summer. It included:
 - doing the groundwork for the hazard markers, mapping out locations where buoys will be placed next summer; replacing some of the informal markers
 - Doing Walk and Talks with the cottagers topics brought up were challenges with the water level, amount of sediment at the government dock, boat wakes
 - Cleaning up campsites they have been left pretty clean except for after long weekends,
 which is to be expected
 - Clint and the summer students met twice with the Park Wardens;
 - Camping on Lake Talon, according to the Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR):
 - As of last summer Blueberry Island and Madora Island were determined off limits by the MNR for overnight camping; there is a required setback from the water for thunderboxes, and neither island meets the setback to have one installed, which is why overnight camping isn't allowed, enforcement of this is an issue
 - There is also no overnight camping allowed at the Talon Chutes
 - The only place identified by MNRF for camping overnight on Lake Talon is at Grasswells.
- During the meeting a number of people thanked the summer students and Clint for all of their work.

12. Blanchard's Landing Dock & Boat Ramp Status – Report by Brian Baker (Start time on recording - 39:18)

- As previously advised, the Ontario Parks Superintendent Warren Verina was able to replace the
 floating dock at Blanchard's Landing with a longer dock. The Township of Bonfield assisted with
 the removal of the old dock and installation of the replacement. Some minimal dredging was done
 at the same time. The dock and boat ramp is 100% the responsibility of Ontario Parks as it lies
 within the boundary of the Mattawa River Provincial Park. No LTCA funds were required.
- Thanks were shared to Warren Verina and the Township of Bonfield.

13. KBRP - Kaibuskong Bay Renewal Project (Start time on recording - 43:30)

- The Kaibuskong Bay Renewal Project (KBRP) and the LTCA have partnered in the effort to secure funding for the dredging of accumulated silt and gravel in the area of Blanchard's Landing.
 Don Paquette is the Chairperson of KBRP. The LTCA has John Kelsall Sr., Garth Gummo and Chris Whalley as members on the KBRP Committee. Nancy Humphries is the Secretary.
- The KBRP retained the consulting services of Bishop Water Inc. to carry out the necessary
 environmental study for extensive dredging in the area of Blanchard's Landing so that the
 necessary permits can be requested. The KBRP received the draft report this week.
- The LTCA Board of Directors has provided a cheque to KBRP in the amount of \$6,000 to cover the cost of the Bishop Water Study and Report. The Board decided with the approval of the Kolaska Family, that their donation of \$2,000 would be utilised along with LTCA funds. Ontario

Parks have committed to pay 50% of the Bishop Water cost later this year. The final cost to the LTCA will be \$1,000.

• The Bishop Water Study is expected to be received by KBRP in August.

14. Water Level Management – Report by Brian Baker (Start time on recording - 50:12)

- The MNDMNR continues to manage the water levels using their historical management practices with a completely new staff than previous years. This spring the water was very high, and the last 6 weeks it has been low but within MNRF operating targets. Some people's wells have run dry. A main part of the issue is there is an allowable one foot vertical difference between high and low water levels. One of the purposes of the KBRP is to help deal with the increasing sediment around the government dock area reducing water depth. A suggestion was made by a LTCA member to survey the membership about the possibility of tightening the operating range.
- Nothing to report on possible transfer of Talon Chutes Dam operation to Ontario Parks. Not likely to happen.
- The North Bay MNRF District has recently established a dedicated email address for water management inquiries.
- Going forward, please direct all communications regarding water levels or dams to: <u>watermanagement.nbdistrict@ontario.ca</u>. This will help ensure timely and coordinated responses according to the Ministry representative.
 - Members reported they are getting auto responses back to their emails saying the water is within the approved levels.
 - The MNRF hasn't given specific feedback other than they were going to try a different procedure (the way they tighten it); the current logs are about 5 years old
 - The LTCA has been in touch with Vic Fedeli

15. Water Quality Testing - Report by Clint Wilson (Start time on recording - 1:04:38)

- The Summer Students, under the supervision of Clint Wilson, have been sampling Kaibuskong Bay and another agency samples the main water body of Lake Talon. The data is submitted to the Provincial database. Clint tests the water in May and June, the students test it in July and August, and Clint tests the water in September and October.
 - Kaiboskong has elevated phosphates coming in from Lake Nosbonsing
- The Federation of Cottagers Associations of Ontario's (FOCA) website (www.foca.on.ca) has information about the Lake Partner Program (water clarity (Secchi disc), phosphorous (encourages algae growth). It includes information about Sampling Results & Assistance. The map on the website allows you to view the Secchi Disk depth and total phosphorus data from sampling sites as far back as 1990.

- The government dock boat launch, and Grasswells have been very busy all summer
- Samuel de Champlain Park is still closed and is hoping to reopen next spring.

- Currently the <u>LTCA Facebook page</u>, the <u>LTCA website</u>, and Newsletters sent via "MailChimp" are being used to communicate information about the LTCA. Use of both email and Facebook has been initiated based on a previous Member Survey. Facebook is used on a daily/weekly basis as appropriate.
- Members shared their appreciation for the excellent communication provided by the LTCA on these platforms.

20. Septic Pump Out for Water Access Properties – Report by Brian Baker (Start time on recording - 1:17:37)

- Muskoka Septic Services from Parry Sound will be scheduled to return in the fall of 2026, being a 5-year cycle. The last pump-out was in September of 2021. The company will share the cost of the service before they come. It will likely be \$1300/\$1400, plus HST for a 1,000 gallon tank.

22. ONCA - Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporations Act – New ByLaws Approved (Start time on recording - 1:20:45)

government has approved our filing and we are now compliant with the ONCA Regulations.

23. Signage at The Narrows (Start time on recording - 1:21:14)

- The issue of improved and possibly real time advance warning signs of strong and dangerous currents at the entrance to The Narrows above the Talon Chutes Dam was made to the MNRF by the LTCA. The Ministry was not agreeable to our proposal and the matter is now closed.

 cost of \$1,500. The initial installation will be for Hazard Buoys only. They will have "PRIV" marked
 on them indicating the buoys are "Private" and not owned by the Ministry. The buoys will also
 have the LTCA contact info on them. The buoys are being ordered this week.
- The following people have volunteered to install buoys in their areas of the lake: Brian Bellefeuille, Dave Humphries, Allan Ross and Clint Wilson. Thank you!

- Brian has looked into liability insurance and was estimated the increase should be approximately \$125/year.
- Clint said it would be helpful to have them all be installed on the same day in the spring, and taken out on the same day in the fall.

- Clint Wilson
 - The suggestion was made to have the LTCA send a message of support to the Samuel de Champlain Park Superintendent and staff after the destruction they experienced from the downburst in June.
- Darren Jackson and Others
 - Preparing for the Possibility of Fires
 - Darren has a water pump by the lake in James Bay with 150-200 feet of hose. He would like people to use it if they need to. Clint shared that there is also a fire pump in their boathouse right by the water; and Barry Theirron also has a fire pump.
 - A suggestion was made to have a formal contact list of who has pumps and other fire equipment, and to include a map too
 - Brian shared that there are now 5 fire pumps in the Shields Bay area.
 - Concerns were expressed about some of the fires campers build on Grasswells. A suggestion was made to make a firebreak to stop the potential spreading of a fire.
 - A suggestion was made to put 5 buckets, 1 at each campsite at Grasswell, labelled with "LTCA" (we could get decals to put on the buckets). Clint offered to label and monitor them.
 - A suggestion was made to publish notice of fire bans when they are affecting our area.

 - A suggestion was made to have a detailed map made of Lake Talon that includes locations of hazard buoys, marinas, fire equipment, and docking areas.
